

London is perhaps the best place in the world to be a student

One reason is its extraordinary diversity; a host of surveys and studies rank London as the most cosmopolitan city in the world. This means that living in London is, in a sense, living anywhere in the world – it gives a simply unrivalled opportunity to explore the food, clothing, art, music, culture of every continent except Antarctica. In London, a walk around the block can be a trip around the world. Moreover, homesickness is practically impossible – the culture of your home country or community is unlikely to be more than a few minutes away.





London is also a world centre for many types of business: finance, public relations and advertising, the creative industries. This creates opportunities for networking that can kick-start a career.

For Americans studying abroad, London has some extraordinary advantages. Perhaps the most important is the English language; London is certainly not an American city, but it is one where Americans can make themselves understood easily. Moreover, the rest of Europe is easily accessible. Paris, Brussels, and Amsterdam are just a short train ride away; the rest of Europe within easy reach by air. Practicum project possibilities are varied and exciting – you might find yourself doing research for a Member of Parliament, a world-famous advertising agency, an international financial institution, a glamorous fashion house, a life-changing NGO.

London is also richer in cultural resources and activities than anywhere else. Well over 100 plays are performed somewhere in this city every night. Music seems to pour from every window: there are thousands of clubs, discos and music pubs and seven major orchestras. The museums and art galleries are world famous, and rightly so.



Student Services

Student services are offered at 40 Melton street, beside Euston tube station. Here knowledgeable local staff are on hand to advise on travel, entertainment, sport and recreation, as well as assisting with all nonacademic issues. Break-out rooms are also available for group work and seminars.

The campuses of King's College and the London School of Economics are just down the road; the latter offers free lectures and events, as well as access to its library and bookstore. A major public library is also nearby.

LEB Education is also a short stroll from the boutiques, cafes and theatres of Covent Garden. The spectacular exhibits of the British Museum, as well as the delightful eccentricities of Soane Museum and the Cartoon Museum, are around the corner.

The area is full of business activity in the creative industries too – several major publishers have their headquarters nearby, and many media and design firms are based here.

It is a short stroll from the shopping area of Oxford street, the spectacular exhibits of the British Museum as well as the boutiques, cafes and theatres of Covent Garden. The local area offers an outstanding array of amenities, with the shops, bars and restaurants of Bloomsbury, Clerkenwell.

Credit System

LEB Education issues transcripts based on the U.S. semester credit system. Most courses carry three semester hours of credit, based on 45 hours of classroom and course excursion contact time. There will, of course, be homework. reading and assignments outside these hours.

Transcripts are issued by Maryville University, St Louis, Missouri (www. maryville.edu), with which LEB has a School of Record agreement. Maryville holds multiple accreditations, including North Central regional accreditation and the ACBSP for Business programs.
